#### **Canadian Performer** **EVE GOLDBERG**

Imagine a kitchen party where Mother Maybelle Carter, Ella Fitzgerald, Mississippi John Hurt, Bessie Smith, Bob Dylan, The Beatles, and Patsy Cline show up, and you begin to get a sense of what it feels like inside songwriter Eve Goldberg's head. "I've never been one to restrict myself to one genre of music," says the Toronto-based singer-songwriter who has performed a seamless blend of folk, blues, country, bluegrass, old-time and jazz in venues ranging from small house concerts to the prestigious Kennedy Center Millennium Stage in Washington since 1990.

Eve's performances are uplifting, intimate and relaxed, and her watercolor voice and solid guitar style has become a favourite at festivals, folk clubs, and concert series across Canada and the US. Along the way she's earned the respect of legendary musicians like Peggy Seeger, Geoff Muldaur, and Penny Lang.

#### **Long Island Performer** **JAMES O'MALLEY**

James O'Malley is a gifted and gentle-voiced local singer-songwriter — and a two-time finalist in the Plowshares Songwriting Competition. This seasoned performer has appeared with Richard Shindell, Lucy Kaplansky, Tracy Grammer, Carolyn Cruso, Tom Pacheco, Caroline Herring, Buddy Mondlock, Janis Ian, Louise Taylor, Chuck Pyle, Cheryl Wheeler, Lynn Miles, Jack Williams ... James was selected as one of John Platt's picks for "New Voices" and was recently the featured guest artist at the ISS Songwriter's Showcase.

Through the years James has performed at such notable venues as Gerde's Folk City, Carnegie Recital Hall, New York City's Town Hall, The Brokerage, The Red Cedar Soundstage, Berkner Hall, radio stations WUSB and WBLI, and on the college coffeehouse circuit from New York to Tennessee, from Michigan to South Carolina. Expect a great show.
